In one study, 88 percent of patients treated saw clearing of a variety of types of acne after four treatments. Many patients also see results such as smaller pores, improved surface texture, and drying and flattening of lesions after the first treatment. As opposed to other light-based acne treatments, such as photodynamic therapy (PDT), Isolaz does not cause any post-treatment sun sensitivity or require any downtime—at most, patients may be a little pink for a few hours after treatment. Dr. Tanzi adds that Isolaz is safe for women who are pregnant or nursing, but until more studies are done, she is cautious about using Isolaz on patients with darker skin.

**COST** From about \$250 to \$500 per treatment, depending on the location of the practice and size of the area treated
